

Public Notice Regarding 2017 Annual Action Plan
SC State Consolidated Plan for
Housing and Community Development

Notice is hereby given that the State of South Carolina has prepared its 2017 Annual Action Plan and the plan will be available for review and comment for 30 days beginning January 9, 2017. This Annual Action Plan is required by HUD and necessary for the following State Programs to receive 2017 HUD funding: 1) Community Development Block Grant Program administered by the SC Department of Commerce, Grants Administration; 2) HOME Investment Partnerships and National Housing Trust Fund programs administered by the SC State Housing Finance and Development Authority; 3) Emergency Solutions Grants administered by the SC Office of Economic Opportunity; and 4) Housing Opportunities for Persons with AIDS administered by the SC Department of Health and Environmental Control, STD/HIV Division. A public hearing to obtain input on the 2017 Annual Action Plan will be held on January 26, 2017 at 2:00 p.m. in Columbia, SC at 1201 Main Street, 3rd Floor Conference Room.

Copies of the 2017 Action Plan will be available for review at the hearing and during normal business hours at the four state agencies listed above, or it can be downloaded from the State's CDBG website at: www.cdbgSC.com.
