Reallocated ESG-CV Funding Justification

The State of South Carolina received an additional \$406,718.18 of ESG-CV reallocated funds. Per HUD Notice CPD-22-06, HUD provided additional time to expend reallocated funds to ensure that Grantees, such as OEO, have sufficient time to re-evaluate the needs within the community to identify the most effective uses of ESG-CV reallocated funds to prevent, prepare for, and respond to coronavirus. Grantees are to determine the strategic use of funding that will have the most impact on COVID-19 response for its geographic area.

OEO has determined it most impactful to award one Subgrantee located in each of the four Continuum of Care regions in the state of South Carolina. The selected Subgrantees each requested additional ESG-CV and provided justification as to needs of their agency to prevent, prepare for and respond to COVID-19. Based on the request and justifications, OEO determined the four Subgrantees and selected them based upon on their geographic location, current ESG-CV expenditures, needs to prevent, prepare for and responds to COVID-19, and capacity to exhaust the funds. The agencies selected were as follows:

Total Care for the Homeless Coalition (TCHC)

Pee Dee Coalition shall represent Total Care for the Homeless Coalition (TCHC). Pee Dee Coalition is a Domestic Violence Service provider and has expended 95.1% of their ESG-CV funds. Also see Pee Dee Coalition's request and justification.

Midland Area Consortium for the Homeless (MACH)

Homeless No More shall represent Midland Area Consortium for the Homeless (MACH). Homeless No More provides services in Richland and Lexington Counties (two largest counties in the MACH) and have expended 100% of their ESG-CV funds. Also see Homeless No More's request and justification.

Lowcountry COC

One 80 Place Charleston shall represent Lowcountry COC. One-eighty Place serves all counties in the COC and provides Homeless Prevention and Rapid Rehousing components. They have expended 87.6% of their ESG-CV funding. Also see One 80 Place Charleston's request and justification.

Upstate Homeless Coalition (UHC)

United Housing Connections shall represent Upstate Homeless Coalition (UHC). United Housing Connections was the only subgrantee in the state that opened a temporary shelter. They also serve all counties in the COC and have expended 100% of their ESG-CV funding. Also see One United Housing Connections' request and justification.
